As a parent- I will participate in student-led conferences and provide constructive feedback, learn ways to support student goals, and discuss the science standards with my student.

As a student – I will demonstrate self-efficacy [one's belief in one's ability to succeed] and explain standards being mastered and how to apply to real world scenarios

Increasing Literary Skills

As a school - We will facilitate and utilize student-led conferences for students to share their literacy portfolios and goals, including a review of their writing samples from the monthly schoolwide writing days designated for students to write on specific topics in a clear supportive style.

As a parent- I will participate in student-led conferences and provide constructive feedback, learn ways to support student goals, and discuss the samples of my student's persuasive writing.

As a student – I will maintain a literary portfolio that will include the self-evaluation of my reading and writing goals, as well as ongoing samples of my writing completed during monthly schoolwide writing days.
